Some of you might be asking yourself...how do I know...**What to Write about?** If this, is you, you have come to the right place? Below you will find three important aspects that will serve as a guide, as you begin creating a framework for your book. To better connect with your reader, answer the questions below in as much detail as possible. Remember, specificity is essential, and it will save you time on the back end.

P.O.

Primary Object

T. POP

Target Population

N. D. P.

Needs, Desires, Problems What do you want your book to do for you?

Who is your ideal prospect?

What keeos them up at night?

Now, that you have answered three critical aspects about who your book is for. Will your book be written from a place of passion or profit? There are a few schools of thought surrounding the advantages and disadvantages of one or the other.

Passion- writing a book about a topic you're passionate about could possibly take longer. As it's a topic close to the heart and you could be pulled in many directions. As you might be thinking about the people your story impacts or it could have you reliving parts of the story in your head. Which could invariably cost you more time, as you could end up replaying all the possible outcomes had you done x. Not to mention, because it's a topic you're passionate about, you might feel as though the book has to be perfect, which could derail the completion of this book.



Profit- writing a book on a topic that isn't a passion allows you to get straight to the point. A profit book can be about a skill or a lesson you learned, and your book is a way to share this information with your target population. Since there is no motion tethered to this book, it's likely that this book won't have as many starts and stops. Additionally, writing a profit book shows you as an authority in your field of expertise.
